Gunning Community Care

Gunning District Community and Health Service Inc provides community support and local access to health services to residents of the Gunning locality and surrounding villages including Gundaroo, Collector, Dalton and Breadalbane and the districts of Jerrawa, Bellmount Forest, Bevendale and Biala.

GDCHS is a non-government, not for profit association that relies on public, government and private sector support to fulfil their mission with and on behalf of our community. GDCHS has recently been able to acquire the services of Leah Lloyd, a Women's Health Nurse specialist to provide fortnightly services in Gunning.

Due to Covid, many people have neglected to keep up with specific checks and having Leah available will mean that local women will be able to access Cervical Screening Tests (the new pap smear); 6 week postnatal check for new mothers, education on incontinence, contraception, and menopause as well as discuss general women's wellbeing issues.

The grant of \$1,500 GDCHS received has meant that to date 25 clients have had free access to these services rather than paying a co-contribution and where circumstances exist where these services would not otherwise be locally available.

over a million invested for our Community

Established in 2011 the ULF Steering Committee had a vision of creating a sustainable income stream for the Upper Lachlan Shire Community to meet the needs of our community without relying on government funding. A goal of reaching a million dollars in capital was set and the board is excited to have now reached this milestone!

As of 31 Dec, 2022 the foundation has 15 funds equalling a total of **\$1,118,055.84**, Solidifying the foundation's importance to the sustainability of our community

Since 2011 the ULF has returned over \$224,577.33 to the community, supporting Aged Care, Emergency Relief, Education, Health, Mental Health and local community organisations. This is a direct result of our fundamental strategy of investing the funds we receive from our benefactors and only making distributions of the interest these investments return to us and our donors



Distribution amounts awarded are increasing each year of our existence as our capital grows. Most particularly in the last three years!

OUR NAMED FUNDS

A part of the GreaterGood, **ACT Public Trustee & Guardian**

In 2022 the ULF established 3 new funds, bringing our total funds held with the Greater Good to 15 which includes the ULF Open Fund & Gift Fund.

In June 2022, following the take over of Crookwell Tarlaga Aged Care by Uniting Care, a sum of \$475,000 was donated by Uniting to the Upper Lachlan Community via the ULF. These funds have been set aside in their own named fund as the board continues to deliberate on the most appropriate way for any income to be distributed.

We also opened the Michael & Wendy Fund and the Roslyn Landcare Fund tipping our capital held with GreaterGood to over \$1 million.

ROSLYN LANDCARE FUND

Supporting people in the Upper Lachlan to enable them to care for the environment.

In the early 90s a handful of farming families in the Roslyn area envisaged the mass planting of native trees to transform what was then a barren landscape. The Roslyn Landcare Group was created in October 1996 and in over 30 years culminated in the planting and maintaining of many tens of thousands of trees and shrubs in habitat corridors across the area. This transformed the Roslyn landscape into what you see today - a beautifully treed vista which has helped the agricultural production with animal shelter and provided habitat for native birds.

The Roslyn Landcare Group have received many awards and accolades for their wonderful work over the years including their involvement of school students in tree planting days.





Unfortunately, in 2021 due to lack of support it was decided the Roslyn Landcare Group would be wound up. Thanks to the residual money left in their account and three very generous members' financial contributions, \$20,000 was raised and in 2022 the 'Roslyn Landcare Fund' was established with the ULF. With Upper Lachlan Landcare, as the network or umbrella landcare organisation for the Shire they were named as the beneficiary of this fund.

Upper Lachlan Landcare has since developed an Annual Bursary Award which will be funded by the distributions from the 'Roslyn Landcare Fund'. This award will provide financial support to people wanting to undertake training, study or to action onground activities that will help them improve the health of the Upper Lachlan landscape.

Landcare is a grassroots movement of groups, and individuals with the shared vision to protect, enhance and restore the natural environment through sustainable land management and conservation activities. The distribution from this new named fund will enable Upper Lachlan Landcare to continue supporting this movement via the Bursary Award whilst acknowledging the legacy of work made by the Roslyn Landcare group that endures across the landscape today.

THE NANCY MARTIN MEMORIAL FUND

Remembering Bill Martin

William Alexander (Bill) Martin died peacefully on 9th Aug, 2022 and yet his Legacy of giving back will continue to live on through the Nancy Martin Memorial Fund set up with the Upper Lachlan Foundation in 2012.

Bill was a tireless contributor to the community, assisting many community organisations with his financial skills as a chartered accountant, volunteering, serving as a councillor on the Crookwell and Upper Lachlan Shire Councils, and for many years both Bill and his first wife Nancy were committed to youth education being heavily involved in the Crookwell Public School P&C.

After the passing of Nancy in 2011, Bill donated \$20,000 to the Upper Lachlan Foundation to create the 'Nancy Martin Memorial Fund' in 2012, designed to lend a 'helping hand' to the students at Crookwell Public School. This Generous gift by Bill Martin in the name of his late wife, created a lasting legacy for the community and now even after Bill's passing will continue to give back.

The Nancy Martin Memorial Fund has grown since 2012 with a balance of \$28,912.13 as of 31 December 2022. These funds are held in perpetuity with the interest earned being distributed to the Crookwell Public School to assist disadvantaged youth participate in school excursions and like events. Before COVID, each year Bill Martin would attend the Crookwell Public School Presentation Night to ceremoniously present a cheque for the distribution of proceeds to the school. This year the fund was able to distribute \$3,970.00.

Remembering Bill Martin - continued

In keeping with the wishes of Nancy and Bill Martin, the Crookwell Public School and the CPS P&C association utilise distributions from the Nancy Martin Memorial Fund to support students to fully participate in school and interschool events. Sometimes this is in small ways through the student support program, such as providing uniform items or canteen lunches where needed. In the years since its inception, distributions from the fund have also helped provide books and learning materials to students, subsidised transport and accommodation costs for school excursions, camps, and for regional sports representatives to attend competitions.

The fund benefits the children at Crookwell Public School by helping to level the playing field to give all students the chance to participate and succeed at school. When the first distribution from Nancy Martin Memorial Fund was presented to the Crookwell Public School, the principal at the time, Mr Greg Atfield, proposed that the P&C contribute an equal amount from their fundraising efforts as a donation back into the Fund. Since then, the P&C has given an annual donation of a similar sum to the Fund through the Upper Lachlan Foundation to help grow the investment and achieve greater returns into the future.

As Bill and Nancy would have known from their time serving on the P&C, fundraising each year relies on the hard work of volunteers and the generosity of the school and wider community. With a head start from Bill and Nancy Martin, and with the P&C's commitment to their annual contributions, the passive income received from the Nancy Martin Memorial Fund will continue to grow and benefit the current and future students of Crookwell Public School.
